The Facebook community is one of the best defenses against abusive behavior, spam, and other forms of unwanted contact. People use their real names on Facebook, and that connects online actions to true identities. We believe people should treat others the way they want to be treated, both online and offline. If you see something that is inappropriate or makes you uncomfortable, speak up and let us know. We take reports from our community very seriously, and work hard to respond quickly.

## **Social Reporting**

Social reporting lets people report offensive material to Facebook at the same time as they alert someone in their community (like a friend, parent or teacher) who may help them address the issue more directly. We hope that features like this will help people get to the root of the problem quickly. As we do with all of our features, we'll continue to refine social reporting over time to make sure it continues to be an effective safety tool.

## Safety Advisory Board

Facebook is also part of a larger online safety community. We work with a diverse set of experts and organizations devoted to online safety in order to bring the best safety resources to Facebook. That's why we created a Safety Advisory Board that advises us on safety issues. The members of that board are leading internet safety organizations Childnet International, ConnectSafely, The Family Online Safety Institute, The National Network to End Domestic Violence, and WiredSafety.
